

- 3. The students perceive a lack of opportunities for involvement in youth clubs and association activities.
- 4. Few faculty members do not give regular and timely feedback on the performance of the students after completion of CIE tests.
- 5. The opportunities provided by the teachers to the students to learn and grow does not meet the requirements of the students.
- 6. The opportunities provided to the students to learn and grow through the courses offered does not meet the requirements of the students. The courses need to be more interactive, flexible, and relevant to the students' needs and interests.


#### Action Items:







Applying the rules, there is no concern. However, studying the graph, we find that there is a need for improvement with regard to the following areas.


- 1. Due to the unpredictability of the examination time-table of the university, we were unable to organize internships. We shall ensure that every student does an internship during the summer holidays.

- **3.** The curriculum needs to incorporate advanced topics like IOT lab to stimulate critical and practical thinking among the students.



Based on the feedback provided regarding the availability of relevant reading materials and digital resources in the library, here are the findings:

- 1. **Updated Syllabus Books are not available**: This suggests that the library's collection does not fully align with the current academic curriculum (R Programming, Android Application Development Books) potentially hindering students' and faculty members' ability to access the most relevant and up-to-date materials for their courses.
- Available Book count is not sufficient: Feedback indicates that the quantity of books and

- 3. Suggest improvements in library resources and digital tools based on feedback. This might include acquiring new materials, upgrading digital platforms, or providing training for their effective use.







- 3. For at least ten days during a semester, introduce an internship at the end of the odd semester.



- 2. Conduct special coaching so that the students can appear for competitive examinations like GATE, Central University Entrance Exams, and TANCET.







- 2. Academic Mentors will check the performance of the students in PE/VE Courses, internship and other institution events be it seminars, workshops etc whenever the students meet them.


