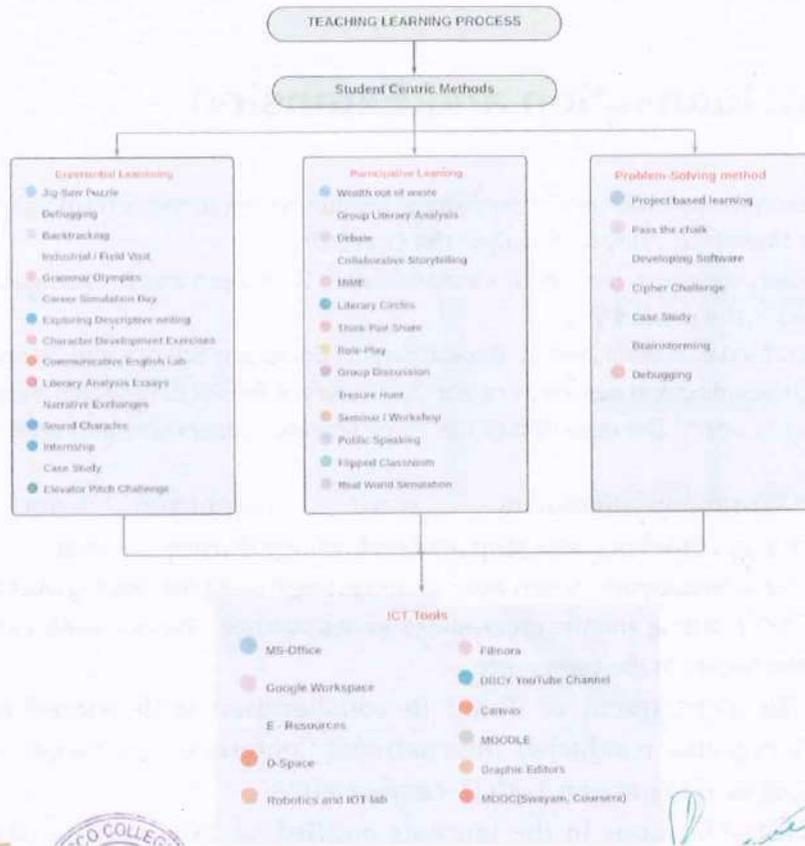

e. The **department-level academic mentoring system**, with one teacher for every twenty students, has yielded significant benefits:

1. Mid Day Meals Scheme: Students facing financial difficulties have been able to join the college's meal program.
2. Improved Attendance and Focus: Previously irregular students are now attending classes regularly and showing academic improvement.
3. Scholarship Applications: Students previously unaware of or who hadn't applied for scholarships were assisted and have since received financial aid.
4. Extracurricular Engagement: With mentor encouragement, many students have actively participated in cultural and extracurricular activities.
5. Behavioral Improvements: Students involved in disciplinary issues have shown positive behavioral changes and renewed focus on their studies.

6. Leadership Opportunities: Mentors have been instrumental in recommending and guiding students towards leadership roles.

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Extension Activities

It is noteworthy that Small Savings club has facilitated the opening of 30 savings Bank account, 28 IPPB Premium account and 15 Indian Bank Accounts for the benefit of the local community,

- f. Linkages with institutions/industries for internship during the year are: 3
- g. **National Cadet Corps:** The first batch of 30 cadets underwent three Combined Annual Training Camps and became eligible to write the 'B' Certificate Examinations and have also passed in "C" Certificate Examination. . The NCC training programs include physical training, drill training, weapon training, map reading, and night march training. Additionally, awareness programs on tobacco and AIDS, as well as events like the Freedom Run Program for Fit India Movement and Yoga Day, were conducted. The college hosted an annual NCC camp for ten days in May 2023 with 500 cadets from various colleges. NCC cadets also organize Independence Day, Sports Day, and Republic Day programs, providing Guard of Honor to chief guests during college events.
- h. **National Social Service Unit:** On 15.05.2023, the NSS unit organized the "Meri Maati Mera Desh" (என் மண் என் தேசம்) d. drive in collaboration with the 10 local Panchayats

around Vaniyambadi. This initiative aimed to promote environmental awareness and community participation. The unit facilitated Yuva Portal registrations, emphasizing skill development among students. **NSS Day Celebration** on 24.09.2023 included a street play in front of the park in Athanavor. On 21.06.2023, the NSS unit joined hands with NCC to celebrate International Yoga Day.

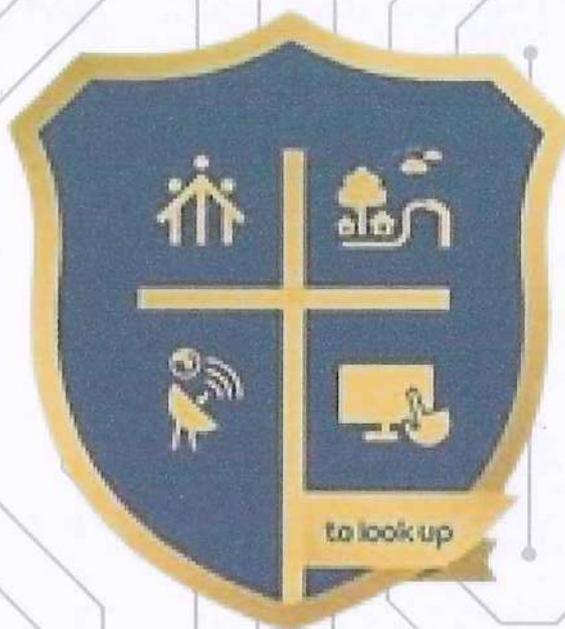
