




SAINT JOHN BOSCO, popularly known as Don Bosco, was born at Becchi, in Piedmont, Italy, on August 16, 1815. From a very young age, he was inspired that he was called to work for the poor boys. Many young people who came to Turin and nearby to study or in search of work fell an easy prey to the social evils of the time. After being ordained a holy priest in 1841, Don

Bosco came to the rescue of many poor boys with his novel method of educating them through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems. He based his education on the three principles of reason, religion and loving kindness. He loved those to whom he dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco did not visualize education in isolation from the community. Vocational guidance and training, job placement and follow-up were integral in Don Bosco's scheme as they are in modern education. The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is known as the **Preventive System**. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed, a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love; it is the method of Don Bosco." The system aims to create a generation of young men and women steeped not only in sound knowledge but also has strong value system.

Preventive System places the students in an environment in which one can be the best. It is a congenial, friendly and holistic approach to education. It creates a climate that draws forth the best in the young people; it encourages the youth's complete and fullest self-expression; it assists young people in acquiring habits that will lead them to opt in favour of what is good, healthy, joyful and life-enhancing. Today, Salesians of Don Bosco have spread throughout the entire world in the service of young people, the poor and suffering, with schools and colleges of every type and level, technical and professional institutes.

Honor and glory to Don Bosco, who lived ahead of his time, had a vision and a practical approach for the development of the youth belonging to the poor strata of the society.



FR FRANCIS GUEZOU - a French Salesian missionary came to India in 1952 and was ordained a priest in 1953 at Tirupattur, Tamil Nadu. After ten years of ministry in Yercaud and Kochi, he arrived at Yelagiri Hills on December 31<sup>st</sup> 1962. Ever since, he has been the primary cause to promote education of the poor, tribal and rural youth at different places of Salesian apostolate in South India.

With his financial support, BICS InfoTech was founded in 1998 to provide professional computer education to the rural and tribal youth.

The contribution of the Association of Friends of Father Guezou in France, founded (in 1964) by Mr Leon Duhayon, a French industrialist is laudable in developing the mission of Fr. Guezou. Fr Guezou died on January 29, 2009. Yet, his spirit is dynamic and it drives the entire campus. Every visitor to Don Bosco Center experiences a familiar family spirit, which makes the young, free and natural. This is a heritage that Fr. Guezou has passed on. A person of great self-discipline with a touch of humor is a great gift that God gave us. As a Gardener in the Vineyard of the Divine Master, Fr Guezou ploughed hard, planted and watered by the kindness of many selfless friends in France and India. He was convinced that only God gives the growth. Yelagiri changed him and will change the destiny of people who will dwell here, because – it's *God's Mountain of Grace*.


#### HISTORY

Don Bosco community envisioned quality professional education in computing as a good strategy to guarantee the employability of rural youth. A non-formal computer training and software development centre (BICS InfoTech) was begun in 1998. Sixty students were admitted per year for the one-year and three-year academic programmes. BICS signed memorandum understanding with Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and CDAC-Pune to conduct diploma and degree programmes.

The institute functioned under three wings: Bosco Institute of D Information Technology (BIIT), the Professional Education O wing that prepared the students to become employable and obtain degree from IGNOU; Bosco InfoTech Services (BOSCO ITS) for software development and training for the graduates who passed out of BIIT; Arivagam (in 2006) as Knowledge Resource Centre. While the students pursued BCA Degree from IGNOU, a rigorous postgraduate Diploma in Information Technology (PGDIT) was offered by the institute. BIIT educated more than 1000 rural students in a decade, as professionals in Information Technology. Most of them are placed in the industry or service sector as developers, testers, graphic artists, technical writers, hardware technicians and teachers.

The primary objective in vocational training was to make them competent communicators English. The students from the rural background speak and write in English fluently within three months. 100% job placement was realized.

It's a divine intervention that in the Golden Jubile of Fr Guezou's arrival (1962-2012) at Yelagiri Hills, BICS InfoTech was upgraded to Don Bosco College (Co-ed), affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University. The inception of Don Bosco College at Yelagiri Hills is a golden milestone in the history of Don Bosco Centre to provide higher education services to more students. Today, the college has six major departments offering programmes of study with the total strength of 1200 students. Don Bosco College strives continuously to apply indigenous methods and strategies to make the students qualified, employable and live an integrated life.

#### ARIVAGAM ( KNOWLEDGE CENTER)□

Arivagam provides learning and digital access environment for all. It includes Print Library (10000+ books), Digital Library (30000 + e-books), Internet Browsing Centre, Media Library (images and video) and Virtual Museum.

While entering and leaving Arivagam, a student must register. Books, notebooks, files, purses, etc., may not be taken into Arivagam by the members. Such materials must be left at the property counter. Only sheets of papers shall be taken inside. The centre is not responsible for any loss of property at the counter. Laptops must always be with the counter and can not be left at the property counter. Borrowed books must be returned on the due date. All books must be returned before the end of the academic year.

For books returned late, an overdue charge of Rs.2.00 per book per day is collected. This charge will be raised to Rs.3.00 per day after a week.

All materials overdue by more than 2 months or not returned is declared lost. The member concerned must replace the book within a week.

If not, the cost of the book shall be charged to the borrower at the current price. If the book is not in print, cost of similar book shall be charged. In addition, the

member has to pay a service charge of Rs.20. The said borrower is not allowed to use Arivagam till the sum is paid.

After using books for reference in Arivagam, the books shall be left on the reading table. All books will be replaced in their proper place by the staff.

All members must show the identity card (ID) to the duty-staff, when requested. No one may bring non-members into Arivagam.

No book is to be lent or taken out of the reference room. Only books from the stack room are lent to the members.

Members shall take due care of books and library furniture. Any marking, underlining or annotating of books is strictly forbidden. A member who is held responsible for any damage/defacement of books or other library property has to compensate for the loss.

Absolute silence is observed in Arivagam. Those who do not comply with, will not be allowed to use the facilities.

Politeness, good order and cooperation are expected from all members to optimize the utilization of the centre.

Interdepartmental books shall be returned within a month. In case, they are required by the concerned department, they may be recalled by the staff.

#### **GUEZOU COMPUTING CENTRE**

Computing Centre has a strong foundation on recent technologies and provides adequate info structure for all practicals. Besides the regular course activities conducted by the Departments, GCC provides facilities for the students to maintain personal laptops and use them on need basis as per the stipulated norms of the college.

#### **COMMUNICATIVE ENGLISH ACADEMY**

It is an extension of the English Department with a dedicated team of language counsellors. The intent is to develop communicative English skills among the students and thus prepare them for the global job market.

The key functions of the Academy are: Theory Sessions,

follow-up, group discussions and Language Token processing.

#### BICS INFOTECH (BIIT AND BOSCO ITS)□

BICS InfoTech, the professional education wing of the college, is the extension of the School of Computing. It conducts professional diploma courses to provide technical and/or professional skills to the students. Employability is the driving force for every programme of study. The Institute has two wings namely BIIT (Bosco Institute of Information Technology) which provides introductory technology training for UG students and BOSCO-ITS (Bosco Information Technology Services) for PG students or graduates. Students pay a nominal fee for BIIT courses.

#### **ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL**

The College seeks projects from the Government of India to provide entrepreneurship training for the students. The College is a partering institute of the Government of India under PM Yuva Yogana Project.

A student must involve in at least 160 hours of extension activities in a span of six semesters. The student's performance is evaluated by staff representatives along with the Head of the respective department on the following parameters.

- 40% for active participation in Youth Club Activities.
- 10% for exemplary awards/Certificates/Prizes.
- 50% for participation in Village Reach-out Camp.

The above activities are conducted outside the academic working hours.

Every student is a member of one of the *youth clubs* of the college. Every student must also participate in the village Soutreach Programme (*Bosco Outreach*). A student may also involve in other extension activities initiated by the College.

#### YOUTH CLUBS

The college promotes twenty-one clubs (groups) of global, national or local significance. Each Club upholds a dimension of life such as sports, social, voluntarism, spirituality, ecology, fine arts and likewise. Clubs facilitate the integral formation of the students. Clubs organize programmes in the neighborhood as department-extension activity. Each Club has a staff representative as animator. The vision, mission and goal setting of the clubs are revisited every year, guided by the animators.

#### **Methodology for Club Meetings**

- Begin with an **open sharing** among members, of their life experience. This should be based on the vision and objectives of the Club.
- Examine the sharing in the light of time-tested principles and laws of the society and nature.
- Go beyond the immediate causes and motives which pretend to justify certain injustices.
- Take strong decisions which include programs and activities which members try to live out as individuals and collectively. This brings out the desired change both among members and in the wider society.

#### **Youth Clubs**

The college promotes various clubs (groups) of global, NI national or local significance. Each Club represents a dimension of life such as spiritual, physical, health, cultural, social, spiritual or environmental. Clubs facilitate the integral formation of the students. Clubs organize programmes in the neighbourhood as extension activities. Each Club has Staff/SDB representative as animator/ co-animator. The vision, mission and activities of the clubs are revisited every year, guided by the animators.

Every under-graduate student has to join mandatorily one of the twenty clubs (Nos. 1-20) to fulfil a singular aspect of the requirements of Extension Activities and thus to qualify for the degree programme of Thiruvalluvar University.

### ATTENDANCE

- 1. The College functions between 8:45 AM and 4:00 PM. Five hours of regular classes and additional ninety minutes of co-curricular or extension activities is held every day. Co-curricular session is not held on Saturdays.
- 2. Attendance is taken in every session, be it lecture, practical or any other activity as per college progamme.
- 3. Late comers cannot be admitted to the classroom without the explicit approval of the approving authorities. Penalty is levied on latecomers.
- 4. No student shall absent from the college without submission of leave letter. Application for leave must be made to the Head of the Department, countersigned by Parent/Guardian/Director of the respective Hostel. When the absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted on return. In case of sickness, medical certificate should be produced to the Head (Note: Submission of leave application with/without medical certificates does not entitle a student to earn attendance for the days of his / her absence).
- 5. All students must be present on the re-opening date of every semester. No leave will be encouraged for the days prefixed or suffixed to a set of holidays.

- 6. Those who lack 80% attendance will not be allowed to appear for the semester examinations. Those who have less than 55% attendance must repeat the semester.
- 7. Any student who is absent continuously for more than 5 days without submitting leave letter should meet the Principal/Deputy Principal, with the parents/guardians before joining the class.
- 8. There are two components in the evaluation of every semester namely Continuous Assessment (CA) and Semester Examination (SE). CA takes place during the course of the semester and the Semester Examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester by Thiruvalluvar University.
- 9. Students will not be allowed to appear for CA tests/ university examinations, if they fail to bring Identity Card. Hall Ticket is also required for semester examinations. A student who resorts to malpractice in an internal CA test will be given zero mark for that test.
- 10. Grievances in matters regarding C.A. will be attended to by the course teacher and Head of the Department.

  Grievances in matters regarding the end semester examination is presented to the Controller of Examinations in the University through the Head of the Department and the Principal.
- 11. Boy-students are to wear trousers and tucked-in shirts with collar. T-shirts of any kind is prohibited. Girl-students are expected to wear chudidhar.
- 12. All students should wear identity cards (easily noticeable) certified up-to-date, when they are in the campus and when they represent the college in any forum. A student must produce it to the duly appointed security guards on-duty at the gates for entry and exit.

13. The medium of instruction and language of communication is English. Students are expected to converse always in English. Those who violate this language rule are dealt seriously.

### **EXAMINATION SYSTEM**

- Students shall conduct themselves in such a manner as not to bring discredit to the college or to themselves.
   The good name of the college is in the hands of the students and the college authorities will not allow any student to defame it.
- 2. Students should be courteous and gracious towards staff members. Any disrespect shown to them will be considered as a serious offence.
- 3. Students are expected to conduct themselves inside and outsides the college as gentle persons and maintain the honor and dignity of the academic community to which they belong.
- 4. During working hours, the students cannot leave the campus without permission.
- 5. Use of mobile phone is strictly forbidden in the college premises between 8.45 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. The offenders will be fined Rs. 1,000/- and mobile phones will be confiscated for the acadmic year.
- 6. Any problem created within or outside the campus with regard to boy-girl relationship will lead to subsequent dismissal from the institution.

### DRESS CODE

- 1. Boys and girls eloping with college mates or getting married to them, during their period of study, will call for dismissal from the institution.
- 2. Students who come drunk or in possession of liquor or any drug will either be dismissed, suspended or debarred.

- work or whose conduct is detrimental to the best interest of the college, may at any time be suspended or dismissed from the institution with forfeiture of the fees paid.
- 2. Any college fine, by whomsoever imposed, must be paid to the Student Welfare fund account of the college.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE 3. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the explicit permission of the Principal. Severe action will be taken on the erring students.

- No student shall be a member of any association not-connected with the college, without the permission of the Principal nor shall a student take part in any antisocial and subversive activities.
- Students are forbidden to remove or tamper with the furniture of the college. Severe action will be taken against such students and the loss shall be made good. If the offender is not traceable, a collective fine will be imposed.
- 3. Smoking, littering and defacing the walls and furniture are punishable offences.
- 4. Whoever directly or indirectly indulges, participates, abets or propagates ragging within or outside the college, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to Rs. 10,000 (Vide L.No. 5/2/Ragging/3/A-III/2000/2003 dated 21.07.2000 University of Madras).

- 5. According to Section 5 Chapter VII of Madras Educational Rules, "Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution".
- 6. Graduate and undergraduate students on the rolls of college are forbidden to take active part in political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. Principal may further, at his discretion, forbid students to engage prominently in any public movement.
- 7. The original certificates submitted by students at the time of admission shall be returned when a student completes his/her study programme or earlier if a student must leave the college. Production of no-due certificate to the office is a must to issue the certificates.
- 8. Students are advised to keep with them photocopies of their certificates before submitting the originals to the office. Requisition for original certificates once submitted in the office will not be entertained.
- 9. Any student, past or present, who needs to get Conduct, Bonafide, Transfer or Study Certificate must apply to the Principal in the prescribed form. The Issue of Certificate requires a minimum processing time of 24 hours after the request is submitted. Original certificates will be given only in person.
- 10. Students in general are expected to reside with their parents, with guardians approved by their parents or in College Hostels.
- 11. Students admitted to College hostel, shall abide by the rules and regulations of the Hostel. Absence from the hostel at night without permission is a serious offence. It leads to dismissal from the hostel immediately. A student dismissed from the college loses automatically his enrolment in the Hostel.
- 12. Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with college authorities in the formation of good character, in maintaining regularity in attendance and progress in studies of their children / wards.
- 13. Parents / Guardians are advised to check, in person with HODs / Vice Principal regarding the attendance of their
