



SAINT JOHN BOSCO, popularly known as Don Bosco, was born at Becchi, in Piedmont, Italy, on August 16, 1815. From a very young age, he was inspired that he was called to work for the poor boys. Many young people who came to Turin and

nearby to study or in search of work fell an easy prey to the social evils of the time. After being ordained a holy priest in 1841, Don Bosco came to the rescue of many poor boys with his novel method of educating them through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems. He based his education on the three principles of reason, religion and loving kindness. He loved those to whom he dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco did not visualize education in isolation from the community. Vocational guidance and training, job placement and follow-up were integral in Don Bosco's scheme as they are in modern education. The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is known as the **Preventive System**. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed, a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love; it is the method of Don Bosco." The system aims to create a generation of young men and women steeped not only in sound knowledge but also has strong value system.

Preventive System places the students in an environment in which one can be the best. It is a congenial, friendly and holistic approach to education. It creates a climate that draws forth the best in the young people; it encourages the youth's complete and fullest self-expression; it assists young people in acquiring habits that will lead them to opt in favour of what is good, healthy, joyful and life-enhancing. Today, Salesians of Don Bosco have spread throughout the entire world in the service of young people, the poor and suffering, with schools and colleges of every type and level, technical and professional institutes.

Honor and glory to Don Bosco, who lived ahead of his time, had a vision and a practical approach for the development of the youth belonging to the poor strata of the society.



FR FRANCIS GUEZOU - a French Salesian missionary came to India in 1952 and was ordained a priest in 1953 at Tirupattur, Tamil Nadu. After ten years of ministry in Yercaud and Kochi, he arrived at Yelagiri Hills on December 31st 1962. Ever since, he has been the primary cause to promote education of

the poor, tribal and rural youth at different places of Salesian apostolate in South India. With his financial support, BICS InfoTech was founded in 1998 to provide professional computer education to the rural and tribal youth.

The contribution of the Association of Friends of Father Guezou in France, founded (in 1964) by Mr Leon Duhayon, a French industrialist is laudable in developing the mission of Fr. Guezou. Fr Guezou died on January 29, 2009. Yet, his spirit is dynamic and it drives the entire campus. Every visitor to Don Bosco Center experiences a familiar family spirit, which makes the young, free and natural. This is a heritage that Fr. Guezou has passed on. A person of great self-discipline with a touch of humor is a great gift that God gave us. As a Gardener in the Vineyard of the Divine Master, Fr Guezou ploughed hard, planted and watered by the kindness of many selfless friends in France and India. He was convinced that only God gives the growth. Yelagiri changed him and will change the destiny of people who will dwell here, because – it's God's Mountain of Grace.


HISTORY

Don Bosco community envisioned **quality professional education in computing** as a good strategy to guarantee the **employability of rural youth**. A non-formal computer training and software development centre (BICS InfoTech) was begun in 1998. Sixty students were admitted per year for the one-year and three-year academic programmes. BICS signed memorandum of understanding with Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and CDAC-Pune to conduct diploma and degree programmes.

The institute functioned under three wings: **Bosco Institute of Information Technology (BIIT)**, the Professional Education wing that prepared the students to become employable and obtain degree from IGNOU; **Bosco InfoTech Services (BOSCO ITS)** for software development and training for the graduates who passed out of BIIT; **Arivagam (in 2006) as Knowledge Resource Centre**. While the students pursued BCA Degree from IGNOU, a rigorous postgraduate Diploma in Information Technology (PGDIT) was offered by the institute. BIIT educated more than 1000 rural students in a decade, as professionals in Information Technology. Most of them are placed in the industry or service sector as developers, testers, graphic artists, technical writers, hardware technicians and teachers.

The primary objective in vocational training was to make them competent in communicators English. The students from the rural background speak and write in English fluently within three months. 100% job placement was realized.

It's a divine intervention that in the Golden Jubile of Fr Guezou's arrival (1962-2012) at Yelagiri Hills, BICS InfoTech was upgraded to Don Bosco College (Co-ed), affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University. The inception of Don Bosco College at Yelagiri Hills is a golden milestone in the history of Don Bosco Centre to provide higher education services to more students. Today, the college has six major departments offering programmes of study with the total strength of 1200 students. Don Bosco College strives continuously to apply indigenous methods and strategies to make the students qualified, employable and live an integrated life.

While entering and leaving Arivagam, a student must register. Books, notebooks, files, purses, etc., may not be taken into Arivagam by the members. Such materials must be left at the property counter. Only sheets of papers shall be taken inside. The centre is not responsible for any loss of property at the counter. Personal digital devices must always be with the owner and can not be left at the property counter. Borrowed books must be returned on the due date. Stall books must be returned before the end of the academic year.

For books returned late, an overdue charge of Rs.5.00 per book per day is collected. This charge will be raised to Rs10.00 per day after a week.

All materials overdue by more than 2 months or not returned is declared lost. The member concerned must replace the book within a week.

If not, the cost of the book shall be charged to the borrower at the current price. If the book is not in print, cost of similar book shall be charged. In addition, the

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member has to pay a service charge of Rs.100. The said borrower is not allowed to use Arivagam till the sum is paid.

After using books for reference in Arivagam, the books shall be left on the reading table. All books will be replaced in their proper place by the staff.

All members must show the identity card (ID) to the duty-staff, when requested. No one may bring non-members into Arivagam.

No book is to be lent or taken out of the reference room. Only books from the stack room are lent to the members.

Members shall take due care of books and library furniture. Any marking, underlining or annotating of books is strictly forbidden. A member who is held responsible for any damage/defacement of books or other library property has to compensate for the loss.

Absolute silence is observed in Arivagam. Those who do not comply with, will not be allowed to use the facilities.

Politeness, good order and cooperation are expected from all members to optimize the utilization of the centre. Interdepartmental books shall be returned within a month. In case, they are required by the concerned department, they may be recalled by the staff.

GUEZOU COMPUTING CENTRE

Computing Centre has a strong foundation on recent technologies and provides adequate info structure for all practicals. Besides the regular course activities conducted by the Departments, GCC provides facilities for the students to maintain personal laptops and use them on need basis as per the stipulated norms of the college.

ELEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Computer-based Education Environment for Teaching, Learning and Evaluation (CEELTE) platform is a blended eLearning environment to improve the teaching and learning process in Don Bosco College by increasing the students' accessibility to educational resources, services, computing devices and software applications. The mortal remains of Fr Francis Guezou SDB was laid to rest here on January 29th 2009.

CANTEEN AND SAFE DRINKING WATER

Reverse Osmosis (RO) treated drinking water plant donated by IVDP, Krishnagiri. A non-government organization provides safe and healthy drinking water facility for all in the campus. Light refreshments are available at the **Carlos Cafe**, the college canteen at reasonable rates. Students are advised to maintain decorum in the canteen and not to buy things on credit.

SPORTS AND GAMES

Open playgrounds namely, basketball and volley ball courts (for girls and boys separately) and a soccer

playground provides apt environment for indoor and outdoor entertainment, besides the trekking opportunity atop the Yelagiri hills. Don Bosco fitness centre is available for all boys.

HOSTELS / MID DAY MEAL SCHEME

The College has five hostels *Ennagam*, *Joachim Villa and-Papa Duhayon hostel* for boys, *Arockia Annai and Mamma Margaret hostel* for girls accommodating nearly 500 students. The hostels have all facilities for study, recreation and common living. Savio Mess serves subsidized meals for hostel inmates and guests. Days scholar who are unable to bring their lunch are given <u>mid-day meal at a subsidized</u> in Savio Mess.

TRANSPORT

Transport department functions in the college to provide transport facility to students and staff from various places. This service is offered to ensure hassle-free and safe transportation for those who commute from the plains.

College has a dispensary with a professional nurse to attend to the emergent health care of the students.

ATTENDANCE

1. The College functions between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM.

- 2. Attendance is taken in every session, be it lecture, practical or any other activity as per college programme.
- 3. Late comers cannot be admitted to the classroom without the explicit approval of the approving authorities. Penalty is levied on latecomers.
- 4. No student shall absent from the college without submission of leave letter. Application for leave must be made to the Head of the Department, countersigned by Parent/Guardian/Director of the respective Hostel. When the absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted on return. In case of sickness, medical certificate should be produced to the Head (Note: Submission of leave application with/without medical certificates does not entitle a student to earn attendance for the days of his / her absence).
- 5. All students must be present on the re-opening date of every semester. No leave will be encouraged for the days prefixed or suffixed to a set of holidays.

- 6. In special cases like sports, camps and other official works assigned by the college, the Vice Principal/ Dean may grant free attendance. Certificate of attendance should be submitted to the college office immediately after the event.
- 7. Those who lack 80% attendance will not be allowed to appear for the semester examinations. Those who have less than 55% attendance must repeat the semester.
- 8. Any student who is absent continuously for more than 5 days without submitting leave letter should meet the Principal/Vice Principal, with the parents/guardians before joining the class.

EXAMINATION SYSTEM

- 9. There are two components in the evaluation of every semester namely Continuous Assessment (CA) and Semester Examination (SE). CA takes place during the course of the semester and the Semester Examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester by Thiruvalluvar University.
- 10.Students will not be allowed to appear for CA tests/ university examinations, if they fail to bring Identity Card. Hall Ticket is also required for semester examinations. A student who resorts to malpractice in an internal CA test will be given zero mark for that test.
- 11. Grievances in matters regarding C.A. will be attended to by the course teacher and Head of the Department. Grievances in matters regarding the end semester examination is presented to the Controller of Examinations in the University through the Head of the Department and the Principal.

DRESS CODE

12. Boy-students are to wear trousers and tucked-in shirts with collar. T-shirts of any kind is prohibited. Girl-students are expected to wear chudidhar.

- 13. All students should wear identity cards (easily noticeable) certified up-to-date, when they are in the campus and when they represent the college in any forum. A student must produce it to the duly appointed security guards on-duty at the gates for entry and exit.
- 14. Formal hair style must be followed by all students both boys and girls.

CAMPUS LANGUAGE

14. The medium of instruction and language of communication is English. Students are expected to converse always in English. Those who violate this language rule are dealt seriously.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

- 16. Students shall conduct themselves in such a manner as not to bring discredit to the college or to themselves. The good name of the college is in the hands of the students and the college authorities will not allow any student to defame it.
- 17. Students should be courteous and gracious towards staff members. Any disrespect shown to them will be considered as a serious offense.
- 18. Students should be courteous and gracious towards staff members. Any disrespect shown to them will be considered as a serious offense During working hours, the students cannot leave the campus without permission.
- 19. Use of mobile phone is constrained in the college premises between 8.45 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. The offenders will be fined Rs. 1,000/- and mobile phones will be confiscated for the acadmic year.
- 20. If a course teacher requires the mobile phones for the learning or evaluation process, the students of the

course can bring the mobile phone and use the same only for the required session with the prior approval of the head of the department. The course teacher must ensure that the prior approval is obtained from the head of the department.

- 21. During working hours, the students cannot leave the campus without permission.
- 22. Any problem created within or outside the campus with regard to boy-girl relationship will lead to subsequent dismissal from the institution.
- 21. Boys and girls eloping with college mates or getting married to them, during their period of study, will call for dismissal from the institution.
- 22. Students who come drunk or in possession of liquor or any drug will either be dismissed, suspended or debarred.
- 23. Any student found to be indifferent or careless in one's work or whose conduct is detrimental to the best interest of the college, may at any time be suspended or dismissed from the institution with forfeiture of the fees paid.
- 24. Any college fine, by whomsoever imposed, must be paid to the Student Welfare fund account of the college.
- 25. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the explicit permission of the Principal. Severe action will be taken on the erring students.
- 26. No student shall be a member of any association notconnected with the college, without the permission of the Principal nor shall a student take part in any antisocial and subversive activities.
- 27. Students are forbidden to remove or tamper with the furniture of the college. Severe action will be taken against such students and the loss shall be made good. If the offender is not traceable, a collective fine will be imposed.
- 28. Smoking, littering and defacing the walls and furniture are punishable offences.

- 29. Any student found to be indifferent or careless in their work or whose conduct is detrimental to the best interest of the college, may at any time be suspended or dismissed from the institution with forfeiture of the fees paid.
- 30. According to Section 5 Chapter VII of Madras Educational Rules, "Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.
- 31. Whoever directly or indirectly indulges, participates, abets of propagates ragging within or ourtside the college, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to Rs. 10,000 (Vide L.No.5/2 Ragging/3/A-III/2000/2003 dated 21.07.2000 University of Madras)
- 32. According to Section 5 Chapter VII of Madras Educational Rules, Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admit-ted in any other educational institution.
- 33. Graduate and undergraduate students on the rolls of college are forbidden to take active part in political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. Principal may further, at his discretion, forbid students to engage prominently in any public movement.
- 34. The transfer certificate submitted by students at the time of admission shall not be returned. When a student completes his/her study of programme or earlier if a student must leave the college, a transfer certificate is issued from the college. Production of no-due certificate to the office is a must to issue the certificate.
- 35. Any student, past or present, who needs to get Conduct, Bonafide, Transfer or Study Certificate must apply to the Principal in the Prescribed form.

- 36. The Issue of Certificate requires a minimum pro cessing time of 24 hours after the request is sub mitted.
- 37. Students in general are expected to reside with their parents, with guardians approved by their parents or in College Hostels.
- 38. Students admitted to College hostel, shall abide by the rules and regulations of the Hostel. Absence from the hostel at night without permission is a serious offense. It leads to dismissal from the hostel immediately. A student dismissed from the college loses automatically his enrolment in the Hostel.
- 39. Students from the plains can commute to the college using only college transport service. Using private vehicles by them is strictly prohibited.
- 40. No day scholar student whose parents are not at Yelagiri Hills is not allowed to reside on the Hills without the explicit permission of the Principal. They may stay in Tirupattur/Jolarpet in consensus with the knowledge and approval of principal and college management.
- 41. Day scholars from the plains are expected to travel only through college transport. Private vehicles are strictly prohibited

HOSTELS

Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with college authorities in the formation of good character, in maintaining regularity in attendance and progress in studies of their children / wards.

TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS

Parents / Guardians are advised to check, in person with HODs / Vice Principal regarding the attendance of their children / wards. For every semester, parents meeting is organized by the management. The parents are advised to attend these meetings to know about the performance of their children.
