

SAINT JOHN BOSCO, popularly known as Don Bosco, was born at Becchi, in Piedmont, Italy, on August 16, 1815. From a very young age, he was inspired that he was called to work for the poor boys. Many young people who came to Turin and nearby to study or in search of work fell an easy prey to the social evils of the time.

After being ordained a holy priest in 1841, Don Bosco came to the rescue of many poor boys with his novel method of educating them through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems. He based his education on the three principles of *reason*, *religion and loving kindness*. He loved those to whom he dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco did not visualize education in isolation from the community. Vocational guidance and training, job placement and follow-up were integral in Don Bosco's scheme as they are in modern education.

The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is known as the **Preventive System**. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed, a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love; it is the method of Don Bosco". The system aims to create a generation of young men and women steeped not only in sound knowledge but also has strong value system.

Preventive System places the students in an environment in which one can be the best. It is a congenial, friendly and holistic approach to education. It creates a climate that draws forth the best in the young people; it encourages the youth's complete and fullest self-expression; it assists young people in acquiring habits that will lead them to opt in favour of what is good, healthy, joyful and life-enhancing.

Today, Salesians of Don Bosco have spread throughout the entire world in the service of young people, the poor and suffering, with schools and colleges of every type and level, technical and professional institutes. Honor and glory to Don Bosco, who lived ahead of his time, had a vision and a practical approach for the development of the youth belonging to the poor strata of the society.

FR FRANCIS GUEZOU - A French Salesian missionary came to India in 1952 and was ordained a priest in 1953 at Tirupathur, Tamil Nadu. After ten years of ministry in Yercaud and Kochi, he arrived at Yelagiri Hills on December 31st 1962. Ever since, he has been the primary cause to promote education of the poor, tribal and rural youth at different places of Salesian

apostolate in South India. With his financial support, BICS InfoTech was founded in 1998 to provide professional computer education to the rural and tribal youth.

The contribution of the Association of Friends of Father Guezou in France, founded (in 1964) by Mr Leon Duhayon, a French industrialist is laudable in developing the mission of Fr. Guezou. Fr Guezou died on January 29, 2009. Yet, his spirit is dynamic and it drives the entire campus. Every visitor to Don Bosco Center experiences a familiar family spirit, which makes the young, free and natural.

This is a heritage that Fr. Guezou has passed on. A person of great self-discipline with a touch of humor is a great gift that God gave us. As a Gardener in the Vineyard of the Divine Master, Fr Guezou ploughed hard, planted and watered by the kindness of many selfless friends in France and India. He was convinced that only God gives the growth. Yelagiri changed him and will change the destiny of people who will dwell here, because – *it's God's Mountain of Grace*.

HISTORY

The Don Bosco community envisioned that quality professional education in computing as a realistic strategy to guarantee the employability of rural youth. A non-formal computer training and software development center (named as BICS InfoTech) was begun in 1998 to provide professional education. Sixty students were admitted per year for the one-year and three-year academic programmes. BICS signed memorandum of understanding with CDAC-Pune and IGNOU to conduct diploma and degree programmes.

The institute functioned under three wings: Bosco Institute of Information Technology (BIIT), the Professional Education wing that prepared the students to become employable and obtain degree from IGNOU; Bosco InfoTech Services (BOSCO ITS) for software development and training for the graduates who passed out of BIIT; Arivagam (in 2006) as Knowledge Resource Centre. While the students pursued BCA Degree from IGNOU, a rigorous postgraduate Diploma in Information Technology (PGDIT) was offered for the students. BIIT educated more than 1000 rural students in a span of a decade, as professionals in Information Technology. Most of them are placed in the industry or service sector as developers, testers, graphic artists, technical writers, hardware technicians and teachers.

The primary objective in professional training was making them competent communicators using English. The students from the rural background were able to speak and write in English fluently within three months. 100% job placement was the end result of complying with the requirements of the institute. In a moment of divine providence, the 50th year of Rev. Fr. Guezou's arrival to Yelagiri Hills (1962–2012) marked a significant milestone: the transformation of BICS InfoTech into Don Bosco College, affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University. This transition heralded a new era of higher education and social empowerment in the region.

In 2012, the college introduced three foundational undergraduate programs: *B.Sc. Computer Science, B.C.A.*, and *B.Com. (CA)*. Building on this success, *B.B.A.* was launched in **2014**, along with an additional section for *B.C.A.* and the introduction of *B.A. English.* The consistent increase in enrolment and graduate employability led to the expansion of offerings. **In 2015**, *B.Sc. Mathematics* was added, and the Department of Computer Science was elevated to the *Postgraduate Department*.

A year later, **in 2016**, the *Communicative English Academy* was inaugurated to enhance students' language proficiency. By **2017**, the Department of English was elevated to a *Postgraduate Department*, and Computer Science became a *Research Department*. To nurture technical curiosity, an *IORT Lab* was established in **2018**, along with the *DB Fitness Centre* to promote student well-being and sportsmanship. In **2019**, the institution proudly obtained **ISO 9001:2015 Certification**, reflecting its commitment to quality.

ON BOSCO COLLEGE

2020 saw the opening of *Carlos Café* for boys, providing nutritious meals and refreshments, followed by the creation of the Fr. Guezou Herbal Garden in 2021, and the Miyawaki Forest, inspired by Japanese ecological methods. The same year, initiatives like Don Bosco Cares for Common Home and Laura Café for girls were established, alongside the Cagliero Multimedia Centre, enhancing e-content creation and academic flexibility. NSS Unit-I and the Bakhita Tailoring Unit were also introduced to foster volunteerism and entrepreneurship among female students. By 2022, the college had expanded its outreach through the introduction of the Rovers Unit. With a growing number of aspirants aiming for military and police careers, the Department of Defence and Strategic Studies was launched. In 2023, B.Sc. Mathematics with Computer Applications was added to further bridge science and technology. Then came the crown jewel in 2024 - Don Bosco College was Accredited by NAAC (Cycle-I) with CGPA of 3.03 at 'A' Grade, a testament to its academic excellence. The AKAIL-Lab was also founded the same year to spark student interest in Artificial Intelligence. Today, the college has seven major departments offering seven programmes of study with a total strength of about 1200 students. Don Bosco College strives continuously to apply indigenous methods and strategies to ensure students are qualified, employable, and capable of living an integrated life.



While entering and leaving Arivagam, a student must register. Books, notebooks, files, purses, etc., may not be taken into Arivagam by the members. Such materials must be left at the property counter. Only sheets of papers shall be taken inside. The centre is not responsible for any loss of property at the counter. Laptops must always be with the owner and can not be left at the property counter. Borrowed books must be returned on the due date. All books must be returned before the end of the academic year.

For books returned late, an overdue charge of Rs.2/- per book per day is collected. This charge will be raised to Rs.3/- per day after a week.

All materials overdue by more than 2 months or not returned is declared lost. The member concerned must replace the book within a week.

If not, the cost of the book shall be charged to the borrower at the current price. If the book is not in print, cost of similar book shall be charged. In addition, the member has to pay a service charge of Rs.20/-.

The said borrower is not allowed to use Arivagam till the sum is paid. After using books for reference in Arivagam, the books shall be left on the reading table. All books will be replaced in their proper place by the staff.

All members must show the identity card (ID) to the duty-staff, when requested. No one may bring non-members into Arivagam.

No book is to be lent or taken out of the reference room. Only books from the stack room are lent to the members.

Members shall take due care of books and library furniture. Any marking, underlining or annotating of books is strictly forbidden. A member who is held responsible for any damage/defacement of books or other library property has to compensate for the loss.

Absolute silence is observed in Arivagam. Those who do not comply with, will not be allowed to use the facilities.

Politeness, good order and cooperation are expected from all members to optimize the utilization of the centre.

Interdepartmental books shall be returned within a month. In case, they are required by the concerned department, they may be recalled by the staff.

GUEZOU COMPUTING CENTRE

Computing Centre has a strong foundation on recent technologies and provides adequate info structure for all practicals. Besides the regular course activities conducted by the Departments, GCC provides facilities for the students to maintain personal laptops and use them on need basis as per the stipulated norms of the college.

CAGLIERO MULTIMEDIA CENTRE

CMC is a centre to create, customize, and disseminate digital media contents for academics. The CMC provides the capability for DBCY faculty and students to learn how technology and multimedia products can be included in lessons to motivate and support learning.

COMPETENCY CENT

COMMUNICATIVE ENGLISH ACADEMY

It is an extension of the English Department with a dedicated team of language counsellors. The intent is to develop communicative English skills among the students and thus prepare them for the global job market.

The key functions of the Academy are: Theory Sessions, Lab Sessions, LSRW assessment, Language Card follow-up, group discussions and Language Token processing.

BICS INFOTECH (BIIT AND BOSCO-ITS)

BICS InfoTech, the professional education wing of the college, is the extension of the School of Computing. It conducts professional diploma courses to provide technical and/or professional skills to the students. Employability is the driving force for every programme of study. The Institute has two wings namely BIIT (Bosco Institute of Information Technology) which provides introductory technology training for UG students and BOSCO-ITS (Bosco Information Technology Services) for PG students or graduates. Students pay a nominal fee for BIIT courses.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL

The College seeks projects from the Government of India to provide entrepreneurship training for the students. The College is a partnering institute of the Government of India under PM Yuva Yogana Project.

A student must involve in at least 160 hours of extension activities in a span of six semesters. The student's performance is evaluated by staff representatives along with the Head of the respective department on the following parameters.

- 40% for active participation in Youth Club Activities.
- 10% for exemplary awards/Certificates/Prizes.
- 50% for participation in Village Reach-out Camp.

The above activities are conducted outside the academic Noworking hours.

Every student is a member of one of the *youth clubs* of the college. Every student must also participate in the village Outreach Programme (*Bosco Outreach*). A student may also involve in other extension activities initiated by the College.

YOUTH CLUBS

The college promotes *twenty-six clubs* of global, national or local significance. Each Club upholds a dimension of life such as sports, social, voluntarism, spirituality, ecology, fine arts and likewise. Clubs facilitate the integral formation of the students. Clubs organize programmes in the neighborhood as department-extension activity. Each Club has a staff representative as animator. The vision, mission and goal setting of the clubs are revisited every year, guided by the animators.

Methodology for Club Meetings

- Begin with an open sharing among members, of their life experience. This should be based on the vision and objectives of the Club.
- Examine the sharing in the light of time-tested principles and laws of the society and nature.
- **Go beyond** the immediate causes and motives which pretend to justify certain injustices.
- Take strong decisions which include programmes and activities which members try to live out as individuals and collectively. This brings out the desired change both among members and in the wider society.
- Every under-graduate student has to join mandatorily one of the *twenty-six clubs* to fulfil a singular aspect of the requirements of Extension Activities and thus to qualify for the degree programme of Thiruvalluvar University.
- Student can additionally choose one movement towards career prospects and personality development.

To help the bright and hardworking students, numerous scholarships such as Don Bosco Education Scholarship, Fr Guezou Student Service Scholarship, Don Bosco Education Merit Scholarship, IVDP Orphan and Semi-orphan Scholarship are offered by the College.

E-LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Computer-based Education Environment for Teaching, Learning and Evaluation (CEETLE) platform is a blended eLearning environment to improve the teaching and learning process in Don Bosco College by increasing the students' accessibility to educational resources, services, computing devices and software applications. CEETLE is an integrated platform with Web Server and Lab-wide Wi-Fi Connectivity that creates personalized learning environment for the students.

SPIRITUALITY CENTRE

Christ the Redeemer Chapel is an architectural landmark at Don Bosco, Yelagiri Hills. Its simplicity evokes tranquility and the inner feeling for God's presence. The chapel is open during college hours. Students and staff of all faiths are welcome to a quiet and prayerful time in the Chapel. The mortal remains of *Fr Francis Guezou SDB* was laid to rest here on 29 January, 2009.

CANTEEN AND SAFE DRINKING WATER

Reverse Osmosis (RO) treated drinking water plant donated by IVDP, Krishnagiri. A non-government organization provides safe and healthy drinking water facilities for all in the campus. Light refreshments are available at Carlos Café for boys and Laura Café for girls, the college canteens at reasonable rates.

SPORTS AND GAMES

Open playgrounds namely, basketball and volleyball courts (for girls and boys separately) and a soccer playground provides apt environment for indoor and outdoor entertainment, besides the trekking opportunity atop the Yelagiri hills. Don Bosco fitness centre is available for all boys.

HOSTELS / MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

The College has four hostels Ennagam and Papa **D** Duhayon hostel for boys, Arockia Annai and Mamma Margaret hostel for girls accommodating nearly 500 students. The hostels have all facilities for study, recreation and common living. Savio Mess serves subsidized meals for hostel inmates and guests. Days scholar who are unable to bring their lunch are given R mid-day meal at a subsidized in Savio Mess.

TRANSPORT

Transport department functions in the college to provide transport facility to students and staff from various places. This service is offered to ensure hassle-free and safe transportation for those who commute from the plains.

HEALTH STATION

College has a dispensary with a professional nurse to attend to the emergent health care of the students.

EDUCATIVE AND PASTORAL PLAN

ATTENDANCE

1. The College operates from 9:15 AM to 4:00 PM, with six academic sessions conducted throughout the day.

- 2. The Attendance is mandatory for every session, including lectures, practical classes, and other activities scheduled according to the timetable.
- 3. Students arriving late will not be allowed into the classroom unless explicitly approved by the authorized personnel. Latecomers are subject to penalties as determined by the college.
- 4. No student may be absent from the college without submitting a leave letter. Leave applications should be addressed to the Head of the Department and must be countersigned by the Parent/Guardian/Director of the respective Hostel. In the case of unforeseen circumstances leading to absence, a leave application must be submitted upon returning to the college. If the absence is due to illness, a medical certificate should be provided to the Head. (Note: Submission of leave applications with or without medical certificates does not grant attendance for the days of absence).
- 5. All students are required to be present on the re-opening date of each semester. Leave during the days preceding or following a set of holidays is strongly discouraged. In exceptional cases such as participation in sports events, camps, or other official assignments assigned by the college, the Vice Principal may grant On Duty status. A certificate of attendance must be promptly submitted to the college office following the event.

- 6. Students failing to maintain a minimum of 80% attendance will be ineligible to appear for the semester examinations. Those with less than 55% attendance will be required to repeat the semester.
- 7. If a student remains absent continuously for more than 5 days without submitting a leave letter, they must meet with the Principal along with their parents/guardians before rejoining the classes.

EXAMINATION SYSTEM

- 8. The evaluation of each semester consists of two components: Continuous Assessment (CA) and Semester Examination (SE). CA is conducted throughout the semester, while the Semester Examination is held at the end of each semester by Thiruvalluvar University.
- 9. Students must carry their Identity Card to participate in CA tests and university examinations. Additionally, a Hall Ticket is mandatory for semester examinations. Any student found involved in malpractice during an internal test will receive zero marks for all tests conducted during that period.
- 10. The Grievance Redressal Cell, organized by the Examination Cell, handles grievances related to Continuous Assessment (CA). Grievances concerning the end-semester examination should be addressed to the Controller of Examinations at the University through the Head of the Department and the Principal.

DRESS CODE

- 11. Male students are required to wear trousers and shirts with collars that are tucked in. T-shirts of any kind and materials such as lycra are not permitted.
- 12. Female students are expected to wear below knee- length churidar with pinned shawls. Leggings or any type of tights are not allowed.
- 13. All students must wear easily noticeable and up-to- date identity cards while on campus or representing the college in any forum. Students are required to present their identity cards to the designated security guards at the gates for entry and exit.
- 14. Formal hairstyles are the only acceptable option for both male and female students.

CAMPUS LANGUAGE

15. The medium of instruction and the language of communication in Don Bosco College is English. It is expected that students converse exclusively in English at all times. Any violation of this language rule will be addressed with utmost seriousness.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

16. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that upholds the reputation of the college and reflects positively on themselves. The college authorities will not tolerate any actions or behaviors that bring discredit to the institution.

- 17. Students should show courtesy and respect towards staff members, and any form of disrespect towards them will be considered a serious offense.
- 18. Students are required to maintain the standards of a respectful and honorable academic community both inside and outside the college premises.
- 19. Students are not permitted to leave the campus during working hours. Day scholars, including students from both plains and hills, are advised to bring lunch from home or utilize the lunch facilities available in the college canteen.
- 20. If a student needs to leave the campus during working hours, they must obtain out-pass from the Vice Principal and submit it to the security personnel at the gate for permission to exit.
- 21. Students found outside the college premises during working hours without proper permission will face strict disciplinary actions through the discipline committee.
- 22. The use of mobile phones within the college premises is restricted between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Offenders will be fined Rs.1,000/- and their mobile phones will be confiscated for the academic year. However, if a course teacher requires students to use mobile phones for learning or evaluation purposes during a specific session, students of that course may bring their mobile phones with the prior approval of the Head of the Department. The course teacher must ensure the approval of the Head of the Department.

- 23. Any issues or problems related to relationships between students of opposite genders, both within and outside the campus, will result in subsequent dismissal from the institution.
- 24. Students who choose to elope or get married to their fellow college mates during their period of study will be dismissed from the institution.
- 25. Students found under the influence of alcohol, in possession of liquor, or using any form of drugs will face disciplinary actions, which may include dismissal, suspension, or barring from the college.
- 26. Students who display indifference or carelessness in their work or engage in conduct detrimental to the college may be suspended or dismissed from the institution, with forfeiture of the fees paid.
- 27. Any fines imposed on students, regardless of the source, must be paid to the College Accountant and will be credited to the Student Welfare fund account.
- 28. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending any meetings or collecting money for any purpose without explicit permission from the Principal. Severe action will be taken against students who violate this rule.
- 29. No student shall become a member of any association not connected with the college without the permission of the Principal. Furthermore, students are not allowed to participate in any antisocial or subversive activities.

- 30. Students are strictly prohibited from removing or tampering with college furniture. Severe action will be taken against students who engage in such behavior, and they will be held responsible for any resulting damages. If the offender cannot be identified, a collective fine will be imposed.
- 31. Offenses such as smoking, littering, and defacing walls and furniture are punishable and will be subject to appropriate disciplinary measures.
- 32. Students who display indifference or carelessness in their work or engage in conduct detrimental to the best interests of the college may be suspended or dismissed from the institution, with forfeiture of the fees paid.
- 33. Any individual who directly or indirectly engages in, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging, whether within or outside the college, will be subject to investigation by the anti-ragging committee. If found guilty, they will face imprisonment for a period of up to two years and may also be liable to pay a fine of up to Rs. 10,000. (Refer to L.No.5/2/Ragging/3/A-III/2000/2003 dated 21.07.2000, University of Madras).
- 34. As per section 5 Chapter VII of the Madras Educational Rules, any student convicted of an offense under Section 4 will be dismissed from the educational institution and will not be admitted to any other educational institution.
- 35. Graduate and undergraduate students enrolled in the college are prohibited from actively participating in political agitation against the authority of the

- Government. The Principal may also, at their discretion, restrict students from prominently engaging in any public movement.
- 36. The transfer certificate submitted by students at the time of admission will not be returned. When a student completes their study program or needs to leave the college earlier, a transfer certificate will be issued.
- 37. To obtain the certificate, students must provide a no-due certificate to the college office.
- 38. Any student, whether current or former, in need of a Conduct, Bonafide, Transfer, or Study Certificate must apply to the Principal using the prescribed form. The issuance of certificates requires a minimum processing time of 24 hours from the submission of the request.

HOSTELS

- 39. In general, students are expected to reside with their parents, approved guardians, or in College Hostels.
- 40. Students who are admitted to the College hostel must comply with the rules and regulations set by the hostel.
- 41. Absence from the hostel without permission during the night is considered a serious offense and will result in immediate dismissal from the hostel. A student dismissed from the college will automatically lose their enrollment in the hostel.

TO PARENTS/ GUARDIANS

42. Students from the plains must use the college transport service for commuting to the college. The use of private vehicles is strictly prohibited for them.

- 43. Day scholar students whose parents are not residing at Yelagiri Hills are not permitted to reside on the Hills without explicit permission from the Principal. They may stay in Tirupathur/Jolarpet with the consent of the principal and college management.
- 44. Parents/Guardians are urged to work in harmony with the college authorities to instill good character, promote consistent attendance, and foster academic progress in their children/wards. Your cooperation is essential in ensuring the holistic development and academic success of the students.
- 45. Parents/Guardians are advised to personally consult with the Head of Departments (HODs) or Vice Principal to inquire about the attendance records of their children/wards. Additionally, the college management organizes parent meetings for every semester. It is highly recommended for parents to attend these meetings in order to stay informed about the academic progress and performance of their children. Your active participation in these meetings will contribute to the overall support and guidance provided to the students.

TAMIL NADU PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT-1997

The following Act of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly received the assent of the Governor on the 14th February 1997 and is hereby published for general information.

Excerpts from Act No.7 of 1997

An Act to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Tamil Nadu. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu in the Forty-eighth year of Republic India as follows:

1) Short title, extent and commencement

This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997.

It extends to the whole of the state of Tamil Nadu. It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of December 1996.

2) Definition

In this Act unless the context otherwise requires, "ragging" means display of noisy, disorderly conduct doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes. teasing, abusing of playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.

3) Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging within or without any educational institution is prohibited.

4) Penalty of Ragging

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates "ragging' within or without any educational institution, shall

be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

5) Dismissal of Student

Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

6) Suspension of Student

- (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, wherever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an Educational Institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution he/she shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.
- (2) The decision of the Head of the Educational Institution or the person responsible for the management of the Educational Institution that any student has indulged in ragging under sub-section (1) shall be final.

7) Deemed Abetment

If the Head of the educational institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action in the manner specified in sub-section (1) of section 6 when a complaint or ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence of ragging and shall be punished as provided for in section 4.
